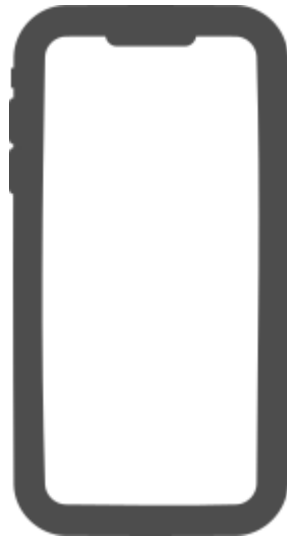

Introduction

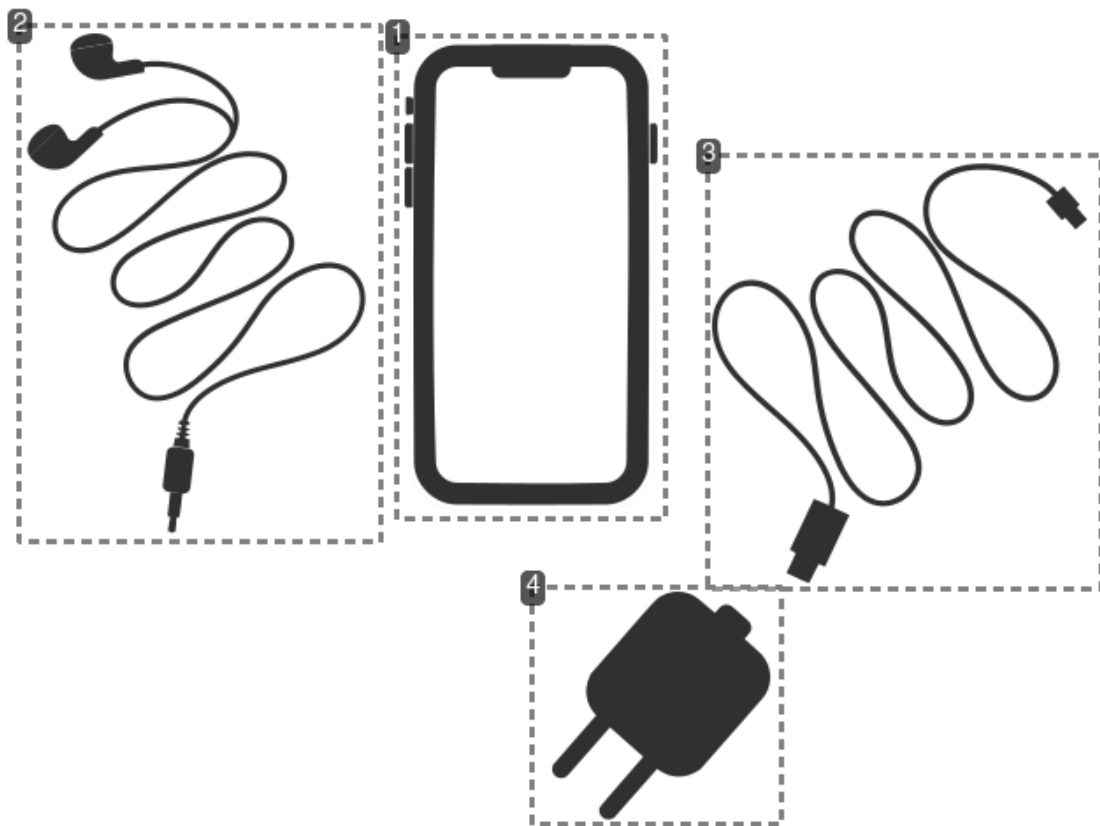
MyPhone, the smartphone reinvented!

1. Content of the box



1. myPhone

MyPhone's body.

2. Earphones

You can use the earphones to listen to music, watch videos and make phone calls.



Note

A jack adaptor is provided with the earphones in case you might want to use it with a jack plug.

3. Charging cable

Use the cable to connect your device to a computer to synchronise and recharge it or to the USB power supply adaptor to recharge it.

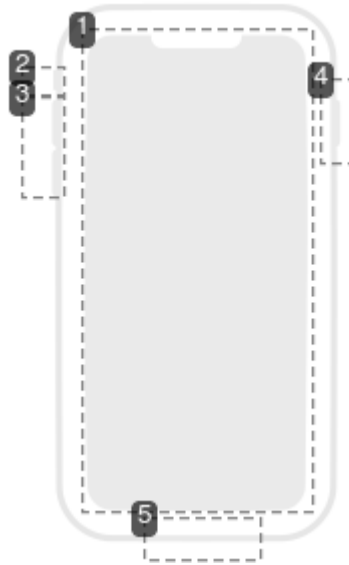
Insert the cable in the connector at the bottom of your device.

4. USB power supply adaptor

Use the adaptor to recharge the battery of your device. The type of adaptor provided depends on your region.

2. Features

2.1. Body



1. Activation

Touch the screen to get MyPhone out of sleep.

2. Ringing / Silence

Switch between Ringing or Silence mode.

3. Volume

Use the up and down buttons to adjust the audio volume.

4. Side button

Interaction	Feature
Long press	Turn MyPhone on/off.
Short press	Activate/deactivate MyPhone.
Double short press	Activate the vocal assistant.

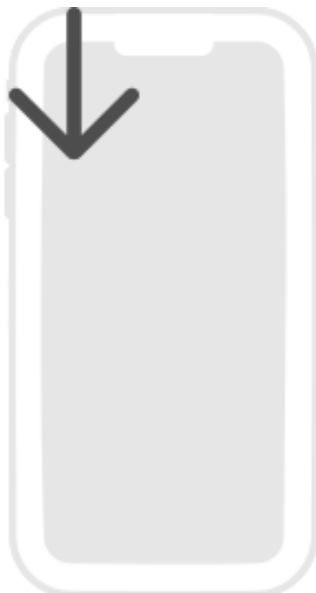
5. Connector

Recharge MyPhone or connect accessories.

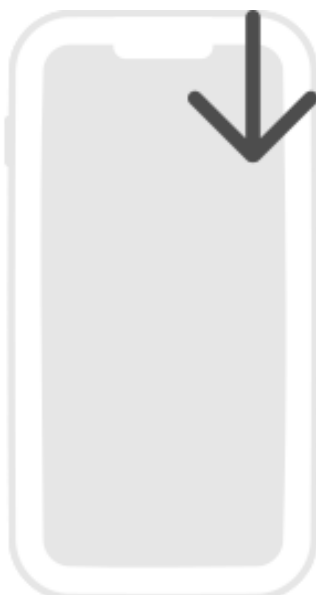
- 💡 **Wireless charging**
Place MyPhone, screen up, on a compatible wireless charger to recharge it.

2.3. PassFace

passFace

passFace recognizes your face to unlock MyPhone safely in the blink of an eye.
passFace can also be used to do payments and connects to many third-party applications.



3. Start-up and configuration

This procedure explains how to start-up and configure your MyPhone for the first time.

Prerequisite

Before starting this procedure, prepare:

- The name and password of your Wi-Fi network.
- Your Str@wberry username and password.
Note: If you do not have a Str@wberry username yet, you will be able to create one during the configuration.
- Your credit card information, if you want to add a payment method during configuration.
- Your former Str@wberry mobile device or its backup data, if you are upgrading to a new device.

Procedure

1. Press and hold the right side button.
The screen turns on and displays a welcome text.
2. Follow the configuration assistant instructions and click on when required.
3. At the end of the configuration, check the box I agree .



Important

By checking I agree , you accept without restriction the terms of use of Str@wberry.

4. Click on .

Result

Your MyPhone is now operational and ready to be used.

Locate MyPhone

The app *Locate MyPhone* helps you find and protect your device in case of loss or theft. This app is automatically activated when you connect with your Str@wberry username during the configuration of the device. It includes a feature called *Activation lock* , which prevents any other person to activate and use your Myphone, even if it were completely erased.

4. Security, handling and help

Warning

Read all the security information below before using MyPhone.

Not following these safety instructions may result in fire, electric shock, injuries, and damage to the device.

Handling

Handle MyPhone with care. Made of metal, glass and plastic, it contains sensitive electronic components. The device or its battery can be damaged if dropped, burned, punctured, crushed or plunged into liquid.

If you think that your MyPhone or its battery is damaged, stop using it because it could cause overheating and injuries. Do not use a smartphone if it has a broken glass, because it can cause injuries. If you are worried about scratching the surface of your device, you can use a protective case.

Repairs

Do not open the device and do not try to fix it by yourself. Disassembling your MyPhone can cause injuries or damage the device. It can also affect the water and splash resistance. For example, it can result in dangerous exposure to invisible infrared laser emissions.

If the device is damaged or doesn't work properly, please contact Str@wberry or an authorized service center.

Battery

Do not try to replace the battery yourself. The lithium-ion battery of MyPhone must be replaced by Str@wberry or an authorized service center.

A wrong replacement or repair could damage the battery and then cause overheating or injuries. The battery should be recycled or disposed separately from household garbage. Do not incinerate the battery.

Distraction

In some circumstances, using MyPhone can distract you and result in dangerous situations (for example, do not use earphones when riding a bike and do not write text messages while driving).

Follow the rules which forbid or limit the use of mobile devices or earphones.

Navigation

Maps depends on data service. These services may be subject to changes and are not available in all regions, making maps and location-based information unavailable, inaccurate or incomplete. Compare the given information in *Maps* with your environment. Use common sense when traveling. Always consider road signs and conditions to solve any existing differences. Some features of *Maps* require the GPS tracking service.
